Delegates and Alternate Delegates - What is That all About?

With the LSI May Annual Conference in North Hollywood coming up soon, I would like to address something that is near and dear to my heart - who and why it is important to send Delegates and Alternate Delegates to the Annual Conference in May. What Are Rules of Evidence?

Rules of evidence govern the admissibility at the trial or hearing of the physical evidence found at a crime scene. Physical evidence includes such things as palm prints, fingerprints, tool marks, tire tracks, footprints, fragments of glass, paint, and wood, clothing, fibers, tools, weapons, documents, containers, hair, blood, photographs, and bullet holes. In order for it to be used at trial, physical evidence must be seized properly, without tainting or mixing it with something else, and under a proper search warrant. It must be done in such a way that it can be easily identified at trial by the seizing officer. This means documenting each item and its exact location (e.g., in globe compartment, in suspect's left shirt pocket). This also explains the lengthy and often voluminous paperwork done at crime scenes by the police and homicide detectives. A competent defense attorney will take advantage of any violations of the rules of evidence.

Legal Procedures - The Latest Updates

CHANGES TO CALIFORNIA RULES:

Changes to the California Code of Civil Procedure and the California Rules of Court will take effect January, 1, 2018. Among other things, there will be significant changes to CCP section 1010.6 regarding electronic filing and electronic service.

SAN FRANCISCO COUNTY SUPERIOR COURT

Effective May 15, 2018, the San Francisco Superior Court will eliminate the Court-run e-filing portal to e-file documents with the Court. UNITED STATES DISTRICT COURT - NORTHERN DISTRICT OF CALIFORNIA

Northern District's Caseload Rebalancing Program Begins March 1, 2018

Starting March 1, 2018, the Court will undertake a pilot program in order to rebalance caseloads between district judges in each of its divisions. As a result, a small percentage of civil cases normally venued in San Jose will be assigned to district judges in San Francisco or Oakland without regard to the venue provisions in Civil Local Rule 3-2 (Commencement and Assignment of Action) and General Order 44-Assignment Plan. The court will evaluate the effectiveness of this program in one year.
