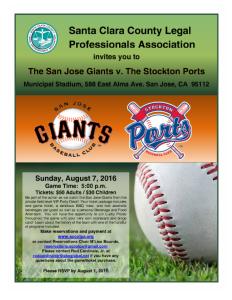

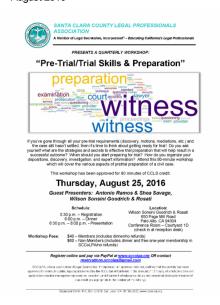
SCCoLPA Quarterly Educational Workshop "Pre-Trial/Trial Skills & Preparation" Thursday, August 25, 2016

EDUCATION IS THE KEY

IT'S HERE: E-FILING IN SANTA CLARA COUNTY - BE PREPARED!

Are you ready? The time has come to start e-filing in Santa Clara County, so what do you need to know?

Timeline:

- On **August 1, 2016**, mandatory e-filing for family and probate cases begins.
- On September 1, 2016, mandatory e-filing for small claims, unlawful detainers, and civil harassment cases will begin.
- Mandatory e-filing for all other civil cases, including limited and unlimited, will likely begin in late fall 2016.

One Legal will be offering a 30-minute webinar on e-filing in family and probate cases on **August 2, 2016**. Register at www.onelegal.com.

Court Requirements:

- File format: files must be in PDF format. PDFs need to be text searchable and exhibits need to be clearly bookmarked.
- Signatures: California Rule of Court 2.257 states that where documents are signed under penalty of perjury an original shall be maintained by the filing party. Documents uploaded for e-filing can be blank (or contain "/s/" followed by a name) as they will be assumed signed.
- File size: The maximum file size is 25 MB. PDFs can be easily reduced to fit this requirement.
- Filing deadline: 4:45 p.m. (filings placed after this deadline will be treated as filed the next day)
- E-Service: California Rule of Court 2.251 states "a party electronically filing any document with the court thereby agrees to accept electronic service."
- Proposed Orders: A version of the proposed order in an editable word-processing format shall be submitted to the Court using the appropriate department email address.

The court will continue to accept the following documents in hard copy form: ex parte filings; judgments; defaults; writs; and abstracts.

ORDER IN THE COURT - TEST YOUR LEGALESE!

What is a class action?

When a group of people is affected by a matter of possible legal consequence, on or more of the group's members may file suit or be sued as the representatives of the "class." In most cases, if the court permits the lawsuit, all members of the original "class" must be given the opportunity to exclude themselves, in case they've had second thoughts or reconsidered a separate legal strategy. If they choose not to exclude themselves from the "class," they are bound by the final judgment in the case, whether it goes for or against them. A class action lawsuit can be brought in all federal courts and some state courts, and has proven an effective weapon in civil rights, public health, and environmental cases. It has also been used, with less success, by stockholders against failing or bankrupt enterprises that either misled them or offered false information to entice them to invest.

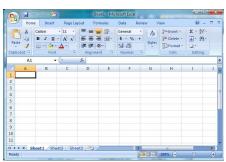

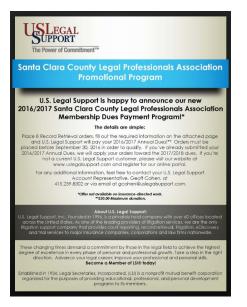
