
January 10, 2017 Monthly Dinner Meeting


Following a series of recently announced changes to the California Rules of Court you may soon need to change how you're preparing and formatting your court filings.

In October, the Judicial Council of California published several <u>rule changes and amendments</u> to come into effect on January 1, 2017. Several relate to the formatting of electronically filed documents. The link to the new and amended rules can be found here: <u>http://www.courts.ca.gov/3025.htm</u>

The changes are intended to standardize the appearance of papers filed electronically and to make them more friendly to on-screen reading. There are only a few changes, but they will require that you prepare your documents a little differently if you are to be confident that the court will accept them.

What is meant by due process of law?

Due process is the fundamental principle upon which the American legal system rests - a balance between the enforcement of law and the rights of the persons charged with a crime. Due process is so vital that it has been written into the US Constitution in two places, the Fifth and Fourteenth Amendments. The Fifth Amendment covers federal law; the Fourteenth Amendment state law. In both cases the wording is the same: no person shall be deprived "of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law." Such concepts as "innocent until proven guilty" and "getting your day in court" derive from this principle. Are you interested in attaining your California Certified Legal Secretary certification? Certification is achieved by passing a comprehensive full-day examination. Candidates are tested in California legal procedures, legal terminology, performance skills, reasoning and ethics, law office administration, ability to communicate effectively, and legal computations. A minimum of two years' experience is required. Continuing legal education requirements must be met for recertification.

Each month we will present a mini "mock" quiz to give you a sense of what the exam covers. The exam is administered twice a year, in March and October and is given in various locations throughout the state. DISCOVERY

- 1. For trial, what is the last day to complete discovery?
- 2. For arbitration, what is the last day to complete discovery?
- 3. What is the cutoff for discovery motions?
- 4. In computing the discovery cut-off, if the last day falls on a weekend or holiday, does the last day become the preceding Friday or following Monday?
- 5. (T/F) If the discovery response contains only objections, it must be verified by the client.
- 6. (T/F) Discovery responses are filed with the court.
- 7. According to LOPM, there are 8 most common methods of discovery. Name them.
- 8. When can the plaintiff first serve interrogatories?

ANSWER KEY:

- 1. 30 days prior to initial trial date (LOPM D-17)
- 2. 15 days before arbitration date (LOPM D-17)
- 3. 15 days prior to initial trial date (LOPM D-18)
- 4. If the dates fall on Saturday, Sunday or holiday, the last day shall be the next court day closer to the trial date. (LOPM D-18)
- 5. False If the response contains <u>only</u> objections (i.e., no answers), the attorney must sign the response, and no verification by the party is required (LOPM D-18).
- Discovery documents and responses are not filed with the court. (CA Rules of Court, rule 3.250; LOPM D-19)
- Form interrogatories; special interrogatories; requests for admission; depositions; demand for records; demands for inspection of documents and/or things; demands for physical examination; and requests for statement of damages. (LOPM D-20)
- 8. Plaintiff may serve interrogatories on defendant either 10 days after service of the summons and

complaint on that defendant, or after the appearance of that defendant, whichever occurs first. (LOPM D-20)

- 9. The defendant may serve interrogatories immediately upon receipt of the summons and complaint. (LOPM D-20)
- 10. 30 days from the proof of service date (LOPM D-22).
- 11. Responding party waives right to object (LOPM D-22)
- 12. The plaintiff may serve a deposition notice on any date that is 20 days after the service of the summons and complaint on the defendant or after an appearance has been made by the defendant. (LOPM D-25)
- 13. The defendant may serve a deposition notice immediately after he/she has been served or has made an appearance, whichever occurs first. (LOPM D-25)
- 14. If no written response (and/or objection) is received, a motion may be filed upon expiration of the deadline, including outstanding time extensions. If written responses are received, but propounding party feels further answers are required, the propounding party may file a motion to compel within 45 days of the service of the verified response document (LOPM D-24).
- 15. The location of the deposition must be within 75 miles of the deponent's address (individual or company), OR within the county where the action is pending and within 150 miles of the deponent's residence (or company principal place of business) (LOPM D-28).
